

Formal criteria for abstracts and case reports

1. Abstracts must be submitted in English (American English), nursing contributions (category “Oncological Nursing”) can also be submitted in German.
2. Case reports “The special case” are submitted in English (American English) via a separate submission channel.
3. The text may contain a maximum of 1,800 characters (without spaces but including references etc.).
4. Submitters must use the Word template provided in the system. The specified content structure for abstracts and case studies must be observed.
5. Uniform formatting (no paragraphs and indentation, Arial or Calibri fonts, font size 11) of the abstracts has top priority.
6. Texts must not be submitted exclusively in capitals. This also applies to headings.
7. Figures, tables and graphics are not permitted.
8. Please pay attention to spelling and grammar, abstracts and case reports will not be proofread before publication in the abstract volume. If you have any questions about your abstract after the deadline of 27.08.2025, please write to abstracts-dkk@kukm.de.

Guidelines for submission

1. Submitted abstracts and case reports may be published at other congresses.
2. Abstracts and case reports that have already been submitted or published elsewhere may be resubmitted to DKK 2026 with scientific acknowledgement of the source. Submitters must have permission for re-publication from the publication or organizer of the previous congress.
3. Abstracts and case reports for marketing purposes or company presentations are not permitted. Scientific papers or studies are not affected.
4. Industrial companies: Accepted posters/free papers may only be presented at DKK 2026 by scientifically responsible representatives.
5. All submitted abstracts and case reports will be reviewed and evaluated, in November 2025 all submitters will be informed by e-mail whether their contribution has been accepted.
6. By submitting, the authors assume responsibility for the accuracy of the data submitted. The responsibility for clarifying any third-party copyrights regarding the content of the abstract and case report lies with the authors.
